



ERCES Letter of Re-Broadcast Authorization

Application for Provisional Authorization: When completed and signed by SNO911, the owner and/or facility manager is authorized to proceed with the implementation of an ERCES at the property identified below using a class "A" Bi-directional Amplifier. Class B Amplifiers are not allowed to re-broadcast on the SNO911 Radio Network. The ERCES must conform to the SNO911 ERCES Technical Criteria available on the SNO911 website. **Note that the system can not be connected to the SNO911 network prior to a successful Up-link Validation test.**

ERCES Final Authorization: Authorization is granted to the Owner and/or Facility Manager as shown below, for the purpose of rebroadcasting the Snohomish County 911 public safety frequencies using class "A" bi-directional amplifiers (BDA's).

DENIAL of Final Authorization: Testing by SNO911 radio technicians at the property listed below has indicated that it appears there is sufficient uplink signal strength from the SNO911 radio network in the building to provide public safety radio communications without the operation of an ERCES. Note that the final decision whether a property requires an active ERCES is made by the fire marshal in the Authority Having Jurisdiction. SNO911 is only responsible to verify that no interference is caused by the ERCES to the public safety radio system. Please contact your local fire marshal to determine next steps
